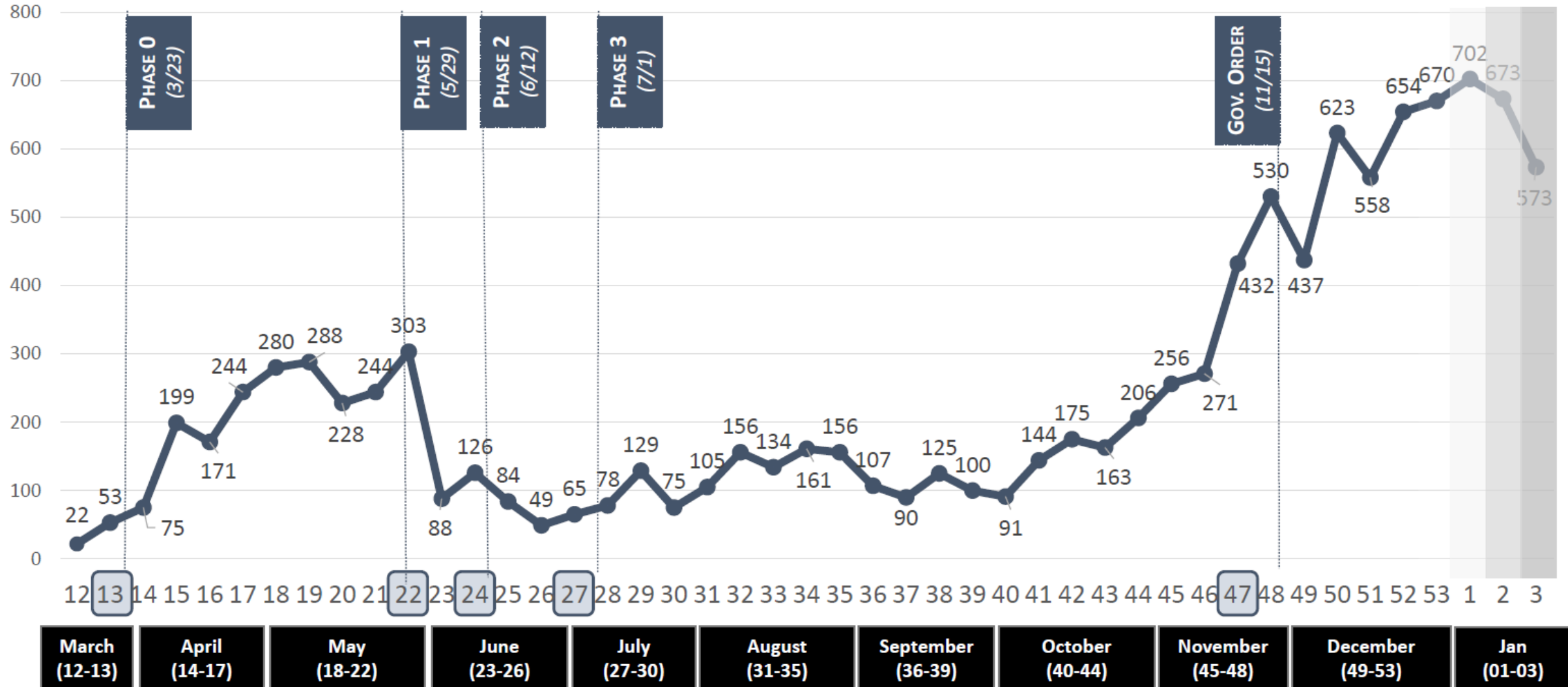


# 11,269 New Cases of COVID-19 in Arlington Residents

# Continue with layered approach to protect yourself and others from COVID-19

- Vaccines are an important tool and now a reality in reducing your risk for COVID-19 infection.
- Vaccines are an **ADDITIONAL LAYER** to add to what we continue to recommend you do daily to protect yourself, your loved ones, and our community from COVID-19 spread.
- So you still need to practice these prevention steps after vaccination:
  - Stay home as much as possible, and definitely stay home if sick
  - Keep physical distance ( $\geq 6$  feet) from others outside of your home bubble
  - Wear a face covering when you are within 6 feet of others outside your home bubble
    - Close contact definition – within 6 feet of a person with COVID-19 for 15 minutes or more cumulatively
